Incident Situation MOB

Shout 'Man Overboard'

Continually monitor MOB position

Approach MOB from downwind or against tidal flow and position alongside MOB, keeping clear of propeller

Deploy lifebuoy if necessary

Communicate with MOB to establish condition

Deploy *rope ladder* or;

Lower seat back and use *spinal board* between back of MOB and side of safety boat for two-person tilt and pull

Return MOB to shore

Incident Situation Medical

Trained First Aiders identified

Apply First Aid as appropriate

First Aid Kits available

Defibrillator available

Carer responsible for client treatment with support from volunteer First Aiders

External Emergency Services – Qld Ambulance Service (QAS) requested as *determined by OOD*

Incident Situation Fire

Raise the alarm with crew

Move crew as far as possible from fire

Position boat bow into wind

Extinguish if safe to do so

If fire source is the motor - switch off

If fire is out of control and if possible,

anchor or run aground

Use radios to call for assistance

Abandon boat when directed by skipper

Incident Situation Adverse weather

Storms; Lightning; Strong winds (>20 Knots)

OOD advises all volunteers via radio if activities are suspended or cancelled

All boats removed from the water or at least returned to pontoon and secured

Safety boat last to leave water

Use QCYC buildings or Sailability shed for shelter

Leave shelter only when safe to do so
